#### **A NEW YEAR**

When I think back on my fifty-three New Year's Eve experiences, I can certainly remember a lot of parties. I was in Times Square, New York, one year and watched the ball drop. A couple of times I had to work, once on an oil rig out in the middle of nowhere in Wyoming. I've slept through several. However, my most memorable New Year's Eve was a very simple one. My daughter Lauren was seven years old and somehow that night it was just she and I. At 11:00 we ventured out into the woods and made our way back to Hidden Lake. There's a large Bur Oak tree right on the bank and we sat down under that oak. It began to snow and we looked out on the lake - so peaceful and quiet - you could hear the snowflakes hit the ground. Sometimes the snow came down so hard it would white-out the silhouette of the tree-line on the other side of the lake. Everything disappeared into a sea of white. I remember we didn't talk much; it seemed both of us were just caught up in how beautiful the world could be sometimes. Then the sound of fireworks began, slow at first, crescendoing into a marked moment – the new year was upon us. We heard someone banging pots and pans...that made us laugh out loud. She asked me "Why do people do that?" I said "You've got to do something!" Then both of us screamed out at the top of our lungs "Happy New Year!" We got up, brushed the snow off of us, and made our way back through the woods and up the hill to my house.

That New Year always warms my heart when I think about it. It's the one I remember and cherish the most. With all the "to do" we sometimes think we must have in our lives – it's really the uncomplicated simple moments, maybe...the pure moments that mean the most. When I think back on what moves me or stirs my heart, they are the simplest of experiences. I remember going on walks in the summer rain with my mother as a child. I remember Dad and my brother and me climbing a hill and sitting down on a rock ledge looking out over the mountains – we were just hanging out together – the three of us. I remember Mary and me cantering our horses so fast through the woods, beating branches out of our way to stay on. I truly remember these times. They are the moments, the memories that linger on my mind. They make me feel good about life. These experiences cost nothing...but in my mind...they are priceless.

The New Year is upon us. Some of us have made big plans for 2013. We've made resolutions, some simple, and some quite an undertaking. Some of us are doing better than ever and some of us are completely starting over. It's a time of the year we reflect back and make choices about what we're going to do. What are we going to do differently this year? I ask myself what has been most rewarding in my life. Sometimes I think things will make me happy – but things are short-lived – they really don't make me happy. What brings the most happiness in my life is spending time with the ones I love. That can be today, tomorrow, anytime and anywhere. I think if you ponder this awhile it would have to be at the very top of your list too!




Fellowship Corner: Niel Hlavatovich


