THIS LAND IS OUR LAND

As I think about my blessings, growing up here and living most of my life at The Center is a tremendous blessing. The people I have met, the healing that takes place here, the entire culture of the staff, volunteers, and fellowship is truly amazing. A deep appreciation of the land, the splendor of nature, and the changing of seasons here runs deep in my heart as well. I have a profound relationship with the natural beauty that emanates from these rolling forested hills, the fields, ponds, prairies, and wildlife...they are timeless, and forever a part of me.

As a young boy growing up in the sixties, there was not one section of woods, or far corners of the property, that I did not explore and become familiar with. My best friend and I hunted arrowheads in the fields, hunted old bottles in abandoned forest preserve homesteads, and we knew every creek, gully, wash, and hill in the square mile of woods behind my house. We played hide and go seek on horse-back in the pines back when you could look over the tops of the trees. We camped out, built forts and tree houses, dammed up Mill Creek to make a swimming hole, and made top-secret paths to our most favorite destinations. In the winter, we ice skated and tobogganed on Groundhog Slough and built fires on the ice to watch them melt through. Back in the innocent days of no cell phones, you just had to make it home for dinner.

When I walk around today I remember it all...where we camped, the tree we carved our initials in (still barely visible), the old swimming hole, and the rocks we used, still there. This land has become a part of who I am. It is always with me. Today, I am much more appreciative of its beauty, its history, and its preservation. My favorite spot on the farm is the prairie looking north to our pine forest. It is a place to go to cast my thoughts and think about things. I have watched those pine trees sway in the wind and disappear into whiteness from a snow shower...so peaceful. The maple ravine behind camp is another favorite, especially in fall. If you time it right, you can shake the trunks of the smaller trees and all the bright yellow and orange leaves fall off, rain down on you, and then cover the forest floor.

I know for me this place and this land is very personal. Four generations of my family have lived here. I also know for many of you it has a very special place in your heart. The Center celebrates its ninety-first anniversary this November. That is nearly one-hundred years, a century, in the making. The dream, the whole concept, has been organic in nature from the very beginning. We have unfolded to the needs of people, thousands and thousands of people. You might be involved in a program here, or you might volunteer, but please do not forget, we also invite you to take a walk in our woods, or around the farm, and simply take in the beauty of this magnificent land and treasure. We have worked so diligently over nearly a century to remain as rustic and natural as possible. We prefer a beautiful walk in the woods up the hill to our chapel over a parking lot right next to it. We have managed to keep a sixty acre working farm just that...a farm.

The land is a gift to everyone, and to future generations as well, to enjoy and appreciate the natural world and the magnificent creation God has bestowed on us. It is not just pretty scenery, it reflects who we are and the community we have built together. As always, your care and support are so graciously appreciated!


WOMEN'S CHRISTMAS RETREAT: Preparing Our Hearts and Our Hearths for Christmas


Farm & Nature Discovery School


