

Christian Fellowship

I have always felt a tremendous sense of comradery and fellowship here at The Center. Even as our world today seems so divided, there is an acceptance and love throughout this ministry for greater and deeper relationships. This has been the case here since our very beginnings. The following is a meditation written by my grandfather (our founder) in 1943. I believe it to be good practical advice on helping us strengthen our ties to one another.

One of the outstanding characteristics of a Christian life is the quality of friendship or fellowship it develops. An ideal church is a group of friends gathered together around a common cause or purpose. It is this that should draw them together.

Christ gave us the supreme example of Godlike fellowship. His disciples and followers were drawn to Him because of His love for them. He first loved them and that attracted them to Him.

This love was demonstrated through His understanding of them. Peter was an impetuous man, a rough fisherman. Christ understood him and brought out the best in him. The tax collector, whom everyone hated, was asked by Christ to dine with Him: he understood and won the man. Mary Magdalene, whom they feared and hated, became a new woman because of Christ's love and understanding of her.

He not only understood and loved His followers, but He also shared His deeper thoughts with them. He brought them to a better understanding of God. He showed them a way of life. He taught them in a way they could understand.

Christ set the example for us in the great field of friendship and fellowship. How can we attain the same wonderful experience? In the first place, we have to love other people. There is no one we cannot make "like" us if we honestly like them. We also need to be slow to judge because that closes doors to us. It is very easy to assume first impressions are real. Another important basis of Christian fellowship is loyalty. This is one of the real bases of fellowship. This implies understanding and standing by in time of need..."fair weather friends" are of little value.

Let us remember, as we attempt to develop Christian fellowship, that Christ loved people. He understood them and saw the deeper good in them. He shared His deeper thoughts and He was loyal to the finest and best in others.

As we reflect on my grandfather's meditation, we are reminded that Christian fellowship is not just a concept; it is a way of life. It is built on love, understanding, and loyalty, just as Christ demonstrated in His relationships. In a world that often pulls us apart, we have the opportunity to draw closer together, to see the good in one another, and to strengthen the bonds that make our community a place of true belonging.

May we continue to follow Christ's example, loving first, listening deeply, and standing by one another with unwavering loyalty. In doing so, we not only honor the legacy of those who came before us but also build a foundation of fellowship that will endure for generations to come.






