This Advent, our Vespers will draw from A Sanctified Art devotional that invites us to both face our fears and insist on hope. Given the challenges of our time, this focus feels especially meaningful as we prepare for Christmas.

The creative team at Sanctified Art writes:

"Jesus entered a fearful world filled with oppression, economic disparity, and instability- a world not so unlike our own. And yet, throughout the stories of Christ's birth, we hear the angel's surprising message: 'Do not fear'. When we find ourselves in fearful times, can we acknowledge our fears while also insisting on hope?"

This Advent series takes seriously the angels' message and trusts that Christ's birth truly is good news of great joy for all people.

May The Center be a sacred place where we can name our fears, face them honestly, and transform them into love and action. What a gift we are given this Christmas- to see more clearly that God's Son invites us to trust His empowering presence and to love with greater courage. Together, may we create a community where courage grows, hope takes root, and love becomes our shared response to fear.




