The Children's Farm at The Center – Palos Park, IL
Seasonal, Residential Position

Overview

Summer Camp Counselors provide leadership, instruction, and supervision for campers throughout each summer session for campers ages 9-14. This role combines outdoor adventure, farm experiences, group living, nature education, and creative activities. Residential counselors live on-site and supervise a bunkhouse, ensuring a safe, fun, and engaging experience for all campers.

Key Responsibilities

- Lead, instruct, and supervise all aspects of the summer camp program, including outdoor adventure, farm activities, group living, nature crafts, and environmental awareness.
- Live at camp and provide daytime supervision for day camp and overnight supervision for a cabin group.
- Promote and maintain a safe and healthy environment for campers, staff, and guests.
- Evaluate camper progress and provide input on program effectiveness each session.
- Participate in pre-camp and post-camp training, preparation, and camp close-up.
- Collaborate with other Center staff to support the broader mission and needs of The Center.

Qualifications

- Strong interest in working with children and supporting their personal growth.
- Commitment to fostering respect, sensitivity, and appreciation for others and the natural world.
- Applicants 18 years or older are preferred; candidates who are 17 will also be considered.
- Preferred: enrollment in or completion of a degree in education, outdoor programming, human services, or related field.
- Enthusiasm, energy, patience, creativity, and emotional maturity.
- Excellent physical health and stamina for working outdoors.
- Current Red Cross Basic First Aid certification (or willingness to complete during staff training).
- Additional valued experience includes:
 - Previous organized camping experience
 - Outdoor camping and adventure skills
 - Arts or dramatics leadership
 - Lifesaving certification
